

**LITCHFIELD INLAND WETLAND COMMISSION**  
**Regular Meeting Minutes**  
**December 14, 2016 – 7:00 p.m.**  
**Town Hall Annex, 80 Doyle Rd. Bantam, CT**

**Call to Order:** Chairman Robert Blazek called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**Members Present:** Chairman Robert Blazek, Barbara Brower, Jack Hamill, Anthony Paradise. Also present were Dennis Tobin, Ph.D, Wetlands Agent, and Ann Combs, Recording Secretary.

**1. Tomascak Plumbing for Fasulo – 96 Prospect St.**

**12/13/16**

*Agent determination for replacement of existing water line from house to curb*

Dr. Tobin reported the resident experiencing rust in the water line. They will install a new line to the house from the city line. Dr. Tobin approved the plan with an agent determination.

**2. Stop & Shop Construction Update #9 - IW Permit #CC00001073:** Dr. Tobin referred his memo dated 12/9/16 to the Inland Wetlands Commission regarding discharge points being free of noticeable pollutant discharges. Northwest Conservation District reported in its #36 report dated 12/6/16 that immediate action was needed as a result of discharge in the southwest corner of the property that drains to White Memorial's Cemetery Pond. Sediment was being discharged from one discharge point beyond a wall they are building. The breach was addressed immediately by Pustola Associates. They had to remove a pipe and dig out the sedimentation. They added more hay bales and reinforced the silt fence. Keith Cudworth picked up turbidity downstream of the sediment pump. They monitored further and found more sedimentation and turbidity, which has since been corrected. At this time the responsibility is with Pustola and Associates, although Stop & Shop has a great interest in it as the responsibility will soon be turned over to them. The December 8<sup>th</sup> action plan by Pustola calls for:

1. East side: policing for garbage and straighten and secure silt fence and remove runoff.
2. West Side: replace outlet control structure; replace hay bales and chicken wire; remove silt and add rip rap.
3. Replace stone track mat; Route 202 will be swept as far as the gas station.

Someone from Stop & Shop or Greenberg will attend the January Inland Wetlands meeting. There is currently a \$290,000 bond. Dr. Tobin said he would provide an update on the inspection bond fee balance as well as a projection of available funds for the 2017 season. Chairman Blazek advised we may suggest

increasing the bond at this meeting. A. Paradise said the piles have not been covered, contrary to their assurances, so they will now be told to tarp them.
